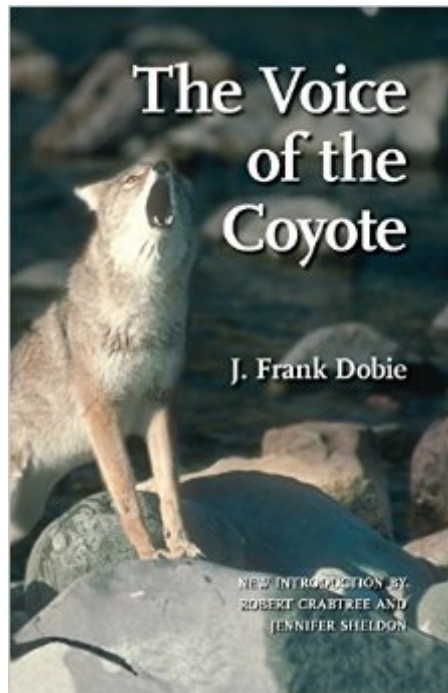

I'd also highly recommend God's Dog by Hope Ryden's God's Dog: A Celebration of the North American Coyote and Eastern Coyote by Gerry Parker's Eastern Coyote as well as The Daily Coyote The Daily Coyote: A Story of Love, Survival, and Trust in the Wilds of Wyoming and Barbara Kingsolver's masterpiece of fiction, Prodigal Summer's Prodigal Summer: A Novel.
